



In Spain 81% of the population buy food in big corporations of food distribution and 7 enterprises control 75% of the Spanish food distribution





Use of the **Intellectual Property Rights** as a powerful tool to strengthen the **monopoly of the corporations and consolidate their power in the market.**





- •To ban the GMO crops from the Spanish agri-food system.






Campaign: "Cultivate diversity. Sow your rights"
